

EMERSON AND DRE'SON CHAMPAGNE HAVE LOVED reading from an early age... since the day their very first book from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library arrived.

Emerson and Dre'son remember the excitement of receiving their books in the mail, flipping through the brightly colored pages and enjoying time alone with mom and dad, reading and laughing together as a family. This excitement of reading soon grew into something that could not be contained within their home.

Dre'son began excelling in reading at school and Emerson began falling asleep with books in her bed, making up her own stories to go along with the pictures.

Several years have gone, but one thing remained... Dre'son's passion for books. His mom and dad contribute this passion to the very first seed planted in their son's young hands, the books that arrived at his home via "The Imagination Library," sparking his interest and igniting his excitement to read more and more.

Emerson's love of her Imagination Library books sparked an idea to share these books with other children. Her library recently received its charter number and is the first chartered "My Little Free Library" in Etowah County. COLTON WAS BORN WITH EPILEPSY AND BRAIN DAMAGE, so he faced multiple challenges. He was blessed with a winning personality and family that wanted the best for him. His mother encouraged him to be involved in everything he could and challenge himself.

He attended Camp ASCCA which provides therapeutic recreation for children and adults with physical and intellectual disabilities from ages 6 to 21. His attendance was made possible with sponsorships from Easter Seals.

While in school, Colton also received services from Darden Rehabilitation Center in assessment, evaluation and job training. After his high school graduation, Colton's Job Developer Dawn helped him find a job at Red Lobster.

He has been employed there Monday – Friday since August of 2013. He is a valued employee and member of the Red Lobster team.



Hightower also took the occasion to honor former United Way President Tom McKenzie with the first Tom McKenzie Community Impact Award.

"If you could see the list of things he's done, it would be a whole lot easier to list the things he hasn't been president of," joked Hightower, before firing off McKenzie's lengthy résumé: the Kiwanis Club, the Boy Scouts, the Red Cross, the YMCA, the Quarterback Club, Capstone Engineering and several more.

"At St. James (Catholic Church) you've been in charge of everything — except I don't think you've been the priest," said Hightower, earning laughs from the audience.

McKenzie said he hadn't expected to receive an award, or to see six of his and wife Charlotte's eight adult children having a mini-family reunion at the theater. He joked that if he had known about the award, he'd have worn a tie.

McKenzie said that he believed he was preaching to the choir, but still offered a reminder about the importance of community service.

"People in the community need to remember, you've got to give something back," said McKenzie. "It's so important, because everybody can't do that. If you've got the opportunity, you need to do it."
